Legal background

 68/2007 parliamentary resolution – Decade of Roma Inclusion Program Strategic Plan (2007-2015) – adopted by the Parliament unanimously June 25, 2007

• 1105/2007 Government Decree – Governmental Action Plan (2008-2009) – adopted by the Government December 19, 2007

Action Plan, governmental measures

(2008-2009)

Concrete projects, deadlines and sources.

Priority areas:

- education,
- > employment + development of enterprises,
- housing,
- > health,
- > anti-discrimination
- culture, media, sport
- + gender equality as horizontal issue

Implementation of Action Plan

(2008-2009)

Targeting:

- > "Group targeting" measures to groups where the Roma are overrepresented, (long-term unemployment, low educational attainment, early school leaving, etc.)
- > "Territorial targeting" measures to territories where the Roma are overrepresented (most disadvantaged territories, Roma settlements, ghettos)
- Programs focused on Roma minority (culture and antidiscrimination)

Sources:

- > national resources + EU Funds (in the New Hungarian Development Plan)
- > Amount: ten billions HUF

Resource allocation of governmental measures

- Goal: ensure access of Roma among disadvantaged people.
- Target programs e.g.
 - > Scholarship program for Roma children (sources: 4,8 million euro).
 - > Housing and social integration program of people living in Roma settlements (sources: 8 million euro).
- Positive actions, aiming to provide equal access measures:
 - development policy based on principle of equal opportunity.
 - establishment / development of Roma Networks e.g.
 - > Roma managers in labour offices (county level) (employees are selected by self-identification),
 - > Roma assistants in primary schools,
 - > Roma scholarships for healthcare providers, social workers, etc.,
 - > Involvement of Roma NGOs.

Development policy based on principle of equal opportunity

- Goal: support projects which contribute to decrease of segregation of Roma in housing and education
- Development of public education institutions
 - > Sources: 11,4 billion HUF = 45,6 million euro
 - > Ca. 1000 villages have prepared reports on the situation of equal opportunities in public education.
- Urban rehabilitation Regional Development Program (ROP)
 - > Sources: 10,7 billion HUF = 42,8 million euro
 - > Social rehabilitation, other developments
 - > All applicants (large and medium-sized cities) should provide anti-segregation plan ca. 170 plan has been prepared
- Independent experts approve the anti-segregation plans.
- Guidelines on equal opportunity in the field of employment, health, housing and education are being prepared.

Legislative provisions

Education – amendment of the act on public education

- Support the most disadvantaged children going to kindergarten (from January 1, 2009)
- Equal opportunity plans are necessary in projects, programs supported by national sources.
- In each schools of cities the rate of the most disadvantaged children (comparing with all of the school-aged children) can be max. 15% more than this rate of the city.
